Helen J. Robinson, a native of Brooklyn, New York, made Maryland her home in 1986, settling in Bladensburg before finally establishing roots in Hyattsville, where she currently resides.

Subsequently, Helen pursued mayoral candidacy, becoming the first African American female to do so in the town's annals.

Helen's academic pursuits are as commendable as her professional and civic endeavors. She holds an associate degree from Prince George's Community College and a Master's Certification in Program Management from George Washington University. Currently, she is engaged as a financial coach and Community Liaison at the Prince George's CC Financial Empowerment Center. Helen's commitment to financial literacy has earned her a scholarship from the Financial Association for Financial Counseling & Planning Education, paving her path to becoming a certified counselor for the state of Maryland upon completion of her studies.
